ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP



New students in our diploma*, degree, and high school programs who have achieved excellence in an academic discipline in their high school coursework or in their most recent academic year of post-secondary study are eligible to receive an academic scholarship recognizing that work. Applicants who have achieved excellence in an artistic discipline are encouraged to apply for a LCV Talent Scholarship.

*CRITERIA & AWARD DISBURSEMENT CONDITIONS

- → Student applicants residing at and travelling from a distance greater than 200 km away from the LCV/LCV High School campus are eligible as follows:
 - → 200 ~ 499km maximum \$500 bursary eligibility
 - → 500+ km maximum \$1,000 bursary eligibility
- → Eligible expenses:
 - → Maximum 2 nights accommodation
 - → Flight, car rental, train, bus
 - → Local ground transportation (transit, taxi, ride-share, etc.)
 - → Personal vehicle mileage claim (\$0.20 per km)
- → E-Learning Diplomas or the Associate of Arts degree are not eligible for this bursary.
- → Recipients of the Associate of Arts bursary are not eligible for any other bursaries, scholarships or awards.
- → Eligible expenses must have been incurred for the student applicant's travel only (i.e. expenses incurred by/for companions will not be considered).
- → Expenses can be submitted for one visit to LCV only.
- → LCV recommends that you keep a copy of all receipts for your own records
