

FURTHER YOUR EDUCATION

Students who graduate from the program will be prepared to begin further study at the baccalaureate level at LaSalle College Vancouver. Credits* from the Associate of Arts transfer to the Bachelor of Science in Game Programming, Bachelor of Applied Design in Graphic Design, Bachelor of Applied Design in Interior Design and the Bachelor of Design in Fashion Design.

You will also have the option to transfer credits to one of British Columbia's research universities. Check out the BC Transfer Guide to see which courses are accepted by over 25 post-secondary institutions across the province.

ENTER THE WORKFORCE

BURSARY DETAILS

LaSalle College Vancouver wants to make it easier for students to complete an Associate of Arts Degree. Bursaries of up to \$13,500 for domestic students and \$18,000 for international students are awarded to eligible students.


^{*}Tuition fees are set per academic year and are subject to change.

Students accepted into the program automatically receive the bursary for their first term. To continue to receive the bursary, the student must be registered in a minimum of 4 courses (12 credits)*, and maintain a CGPA of 2.4/4.0 each term. Bursaries are not refundable or transferable across programs and can only be used towards tuition.

Bursary recipients are expected to contribute to the college community, assist prospective students and get involved with events. Students are expected to volunteer a certain amount of hours.

^{*} Exceptions to the course load requirement are made if a student has a documented learning accommodation requirement and/or is in the final quarter to complete the program.





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
