

## **TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID**

#### **Domestic Applicants**

#### 1. Government Student Loans

Financial assistance may be available for full-time students (those taking 60% or more of a full course load or 40% for students with permanent disabilities who have been approved by the ministry to study at the reduced course load), who are Canadian citizens, a permanent resident or have protected person status, through the Canadian and provincial government student loans programs. Students must apply for loans through the province or territory in which they have established residency.

Residents of British Columbia can apply for loans through StudentAid BC. This combines the Federal Canada Student Loan / Grant Program as well as the Provincial BC Student Loan / Grant Program. Eligibility is determined by those agencies, which are independent of LaSalle College Vancouver.

#### 2. Canada Student Grants

Eligibility for Canada Student Grants is automatically assessed when a student applies and qualifies for a government student loan.

#### 3. Lifelong Learning Plan (LLP)

The LLP allows eligible full-time students to withdraw up to \$10,000 per year, tax-free, and up to the total plan limit of \$20,000 from their registered retirement savings fund (RRSP)

#### 4. Student Line of Credit

Financial institutions may offer student lines of credit or other private loans.

#### 5. Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP)

RESPs permit savings to grow tax-free until the beneficiary is ready to enroll full-time into a qualified post-secondary institution.

#### 6. Payment Plans

Subject to credit approval by the Student Financial Services Department, payment plans are available in some circumstances. Payment plans require proof that the student has the financial capacity to make payments and in some cases will require additional guarantees or co-signers.

Note: All international students are required to pay 50% of the first quarter tuition or \$3,000, whichever is less, prior to receiving a Conditional Letter of Acceptance.

# ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

The language of instruction at LCV is English. Applicants can demonstrate their English language competency in one of the following ways:

- 1) Achieve minimum scores on tests of English proficiency as described in the English Language Proficiency table below.
- 2) For degree applicants, achieve a grade of 68 percent in any one of: BC English 12, English Literature 12, English 12 First Peoples, Communications 12 or Technical and Professional Communications 12 or equivalent in another high school system. For diploma applicants, achieve a grade of 55 percent in any one of: BC English 12, English Literature 12, English 12 First Peoples, Communications 12 or Technical and Professional Communications 12 or equivalent in another high school system. Equivalencies can only be determined by the Chief Academic Officer.
- 3) Advanced Placement (AP) English Language or English Literature, minimum grade of 3 or 68 percent.
- 4) International Baccalaureate (IB) English Language A1 or A2 (Higher or Standard level), minimum grade of 5 or better.
- 5) Proof of undergraduate or higher degree conferral from a recognized post-secondary institution where English is the language of instruction.
- 6) Achieve 68 percent or higher in 100-level English language course at a recognized post-secondary institution.
- 7) Successful completion of a minimum of two consecutive full-time academic semesters or quarters of post-secondary course work at an equivalent credential level, with a minimum overall score of 68% for degree and 55% for diploma, at a recognized college or university in which English is the language of instruction. Successful completion is defined as passing all courses for which the student was registered during the two semesters.
- 8) Achieve a PASS on GED administered in English.
- 9) 480 score or higher on the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing Section of the SAT.


